



WHO CAN APPLY?

The British Judo Trust will only accept applications from organisations or individuals that have project(s) that answer the following criteria:

- To advance the physical education of the general public in judo with an emphasis on young and socially and economically disadvantaged persons
- Promoting and teaching judo
- Providing and enhancing judo facilities and providing coaching and other resources to help ensure that judo is accessible to as many people as reasonably possible
- Promoting judo as a means of social inclusion
- Providing financial resources and a structural pathway to increase participation in grass roots judo, with a specific focus on increasing participation in judo in disadvantage areas
- Providing financial support for judo players who might otherwise have to reduce their involvement in the sport due to limited financial means.
- Widening Participation in judo
- Developing People within judo
- Judo Facility Development
- Have a clear development plan in place to involve more people to take up judo through a structured programme of activities.
- The scheme/project is aimed at helping people to progress from participation through to performance and excellence where appropriate.
- That the scheme/project provides appropriate exit routes for those participating (e.g. a safe and welcoming club environment for juniors to continue their sport).
- Where possible, the scheme/project is aimed at increasing the number of new coaches and upgrading existing coaches within judo and/or to increase the knowledge and standard of coaches and volunteers involved in clubs through nationally recognised coach education courses.

PRIORITY WILL BE GIVEN TO:

Organisations working in areas of greatest social need or deprivation as deemed by Local Government report(s).

Schemes that are designed to involve large numbers of participants and create long term opportunities.

WE DO NOT FUND

- General fundraising appeals
- Requests for retrospective funding
- Other grant-making bodies to make grants on the Trusts behalf
- Projects that directly replace statutory funding or activities that are primarily the responsibility of central or local government
- Projects that are solely for the promotion of religion
